# A few cyber safety tips to go...

## Don't use the same password for everything

If one account using the password becomes compromised, any other accounts using the same password may also be at risk.

## Don't click on any links or attachments in emails if you don't know and trust the sender

These may redirect you to risky sites or download malware (malicious software) to your device.

## Be cautious about what information you share and with whom

This includes the information you share with others directly (for example in a messaging platform) and information you share on social media. Ask yourself what a stranger might do with this information!

## Keep everything updated

Be vigilant about updating software, including apps, anti-virus and even your browser. These updates help to keep you secure against attacks.
